Mentoring & the Sacred Hunt

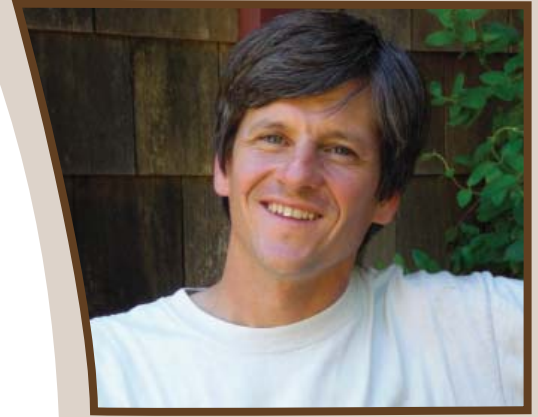
Friday, FEBRUARY 27 – Sunday, MARCH 1
