As an internationally known authority on animal behavior and human evolution, Dr. Eaton has appeared on PBS TV's NOVA, CBS TV National News, Fox TV National News, and starred in an ABC TV award-winning serial. Interviews in LA Times, New York Times, Washington Post, Sports Illustrated and Saturday Review, and on NPR and BBC. Editor of **The Human/Animal Connection** with contributions from Gary Snyder and Paul Shepard, and editor of the journal **Carnivore: Interfacing Biology, Anthropology and Environmental Studies**. The recipient of two national book awards, he is the author of **The Human Carnivore** and **From Boys to Men of Heart: Hunting as Rite of Passage and the Recovery of Nature-Culture**, and producer of **The Sacred Hunt**, winner of seven awards. Dr. Eaton has held faculty posts in zoology, psychology, wildlife biology and humanities at several major universities, and is a Pipe Holder in the Cherokee tradition. He is a Research Associate of the Circumpolar Institute, University of Alberta, and an advisor to World Conservation Force.
