To whom it may concern:

I am writing this letter as a personal endorsement of Dr. Randall Eaton. I am a former student of Professor Eaton at Old College at Reno.

I studied under Professor Eaton in Man as Hunter, an interdisciplinary study of hunting and gathering societies, in the spring term of 1983. This class incorporated environmental factors, sociological and anthropological impact, psychological tendencies, genetic and socio-biological aspects, and the symbolism of trophy hunting into a comprehensive over-view of primitive cultures. I was also a student in his Life on Earth class during the fall semester of that year. This was a study of natural history with the focus on the development and evolution of life-forms and their interaction with the environment, their cause and effect relationships.

Professor Eaton donated some of his valuable time in helping to critique (through several re-writes) a book review I was writing for Carnivore magazine, of which Dr. Eaton is on the editorial staff, even though this was a project for another professor. He also worked with me on an independent study program and is still aiding in my efforts to write a book based on my personal experiences. Dr. Eaton also served as my faculty advisor during the 1983 year at Old College and I feel fully competent in expounding on his qualities as an instructor.


Throughout my many dealings with Dr. Eaton I have always found him to be both accessible and helpful. He possesses a vast wealth of knowledge spanning various disciplines but remains easy to communicate with. He has proven himself to be very energetic and dedicated. I think he is a credit to academe and I would recommend him highly to any institution of higher learning.

I would like to qualify this recommendation by stressing that I am not an impressionable youth. I'm forty years old and have been around the block a few times, so to speak. I am the product of a poor uneducated family, grew up in the streets, and spent nine years in various correctional institutions by the time I turned thirty. I have since received my associate degree in Administration of Justice from Truckee Meadows Community College, attended the University of Nevada at Reno briefly, and completed my bachelor's degree in Humanities at Old College. I am employed as a Senior Supervisor at Wittenberg Hall juvenile detention facility, serve on the Washoe County Jail Advisory Committee, act as a resource person and faculty advisor for the National Judicial College, and am a frequent lecturer at the Nevada State Prison.

I am sorry to hear that Dr. Eaton is seeking a position elsewhere but assure you that the loss will be Old College's. It is

without hesitation that I recommend this fine individual for serious consideration for appointment to your staff.
